Learning

Lunches for Learning exists to break the cycle of poverty in rural Honduras. By providing a nutritious lunch to elementary school children at their school every day, these children have the opportunity to remain in school so they can complete their education and enter the workforce as literate individuals. The children in rural Honduras, in most instances, have to walk an hour or more over rugged mountain roads to get to school and then repeat the journey after school. Chances are they did not have breakfast because the family didn't have the food to spare. Lunches for learning motivates children to go to school through at least the sixth grade and learn to read, write, and acquire necessary math skills. The program invariably improves health and wellbeing of these children and gives them the capabilities to move beyond abject poverty. Ron Hicks. former member of Montgomery Capital Rotary Club, started this program. Sadly, Ron died last year, but knowing that the program had grown far beyond our sponsorship.
